The collaborative currently has over 500 members, increasing at a rate of around 25% a year.

Impacts so far



Many webinars and workshops have been delivered to a range of audiences, with attendees spread across the country



Over 9000 carers were trained using Train the Trainer and videos supporting this training continue to be widely shared across the NHS, with over 350,000 views



Annual Health Check videos coproduced with NHSE and Misfits Theatre company viewed over 10,000 times so far.



Supported the wider NHSE agenda by helping with the roll out of Virtual Wards and NHS@Home, providing case studies for the role out of Martha's rule roll out and more.
