

West of England Acute Mortality Review - Supporting the Hospital Trainers Programme

Trusts in the West of England are being supported by the West of England Academic Health Science Network to develop a best practice framework for acute mortality reviews which will allow us to share best practice and implement the national approach to structured case note review.

Aims of the training:

1. To enable organisations to collect mortality information on the safety and quality of care in sufficient and comparable detail to support both quality improvement and clinical governance needs.
2. To provide hospital training teams with the knowledge and review expertise required to support explicit structured judgement review across organisations and teams.

The programme will be a full day of information exchange and interactive learning, based round a core of undertaking two case record reviews and delivered in an informal setting. The programme will be led by Dr Andrew Gibson and Professor Allen Hutchinson.
